# Political Parties and Political Campaigns (S)

Political parties are important parts of our current political system. By yourself, you will create your political party and campaign for a candidate from the party.

## Part 1: Platform and Planning

- 1. Create a **party name** and **animal symbol** that are connected in some way to the qualities you think the government should possess and that your party will represent (remember: the democratic donkey is smart and bold; the republican elephant is strong and dignified).
- 2. Create a **slogan** that your party will use during the campaign period.
- 3. Decide where on the **political spectrum** your party falls (liberal, moderate, conservative?)
- 4. Think about the issues that will bind your party members together. What are the best things about America? What are America's biggest problems? Each group should create a **party platform** that include at least **4 planks** (the copy that is turned in, should be neatly typed or written)

# Part 2: Product

- 3. By yourself, you will have to campaign for a candidate, ONE of the following must be created by your group and presented to the class on Election Day.
  - a. Campaign Poster (For the person who represents your party).
    - i. Must contain the name of the party, party animal, slogan, platform.

# ALL campaign materials MUST be school appropriate and should ONLY contain negative campaigning against national political candidates (not against any peers/ classmates)
