 When World War I began, the United States practiced isolationism and remained neutral. However, events would bring the U.S. into the conflict.





<ul> <li>1914</li> <li>Triple Entente (no separate peace)</li> <li>Britain, Russia and France agreed not to sign for peace separately</li> </ul>		1894 Franco-Russian Alliance Russia formed an alliance with France to protect herself against Germany and Austria-Hungary
1907 Triple Entente This was made between Russia, France and Britain to counter the increasing threat from Germany.	1907 Anglo-Russian Entente This was an agreement between Britain and Russia	1904 Entente Cordiale This was an agreement, but not a formal alliance, between France and Britain

# The War Begins Each nation that was in an alliance and had built up their military declared war on the opposite alliance and all of Europe fell into war.






# America's Neutrality




# **Impact of Neutrality** The desire to not be involved in foreign affairs will lead the US to not approve the Treaty of Versailles after World War I.






#### The Sinking of the Lusitania



The Sinking of the Lusitania A German U-Boat (submarine) sank the Lusitania killing 128 Americans. -Wilson responded with a diplomatic warning.



The U.S. government was officially neutral. •U.S. businesses were providing goods to the British and French. U.S. Banks had loaned the British and French \$3 Billion Dollars.

#### **Decision for War** Zimmerman Telegram → Germany sent Mexico a message asking the to ally with Germany and go to war with the U.S. They promised Mexico lands in the Southwest United States. Angered the American People.

#### The Zimmerman Telegram

TELEGRAM RECEIVED.

By Much & Echloff Autourit

FROM 2nd from London # 5747.

"We intend to begin on the first of February unrestricted submarine warfare. We shall endeavor in spite of this to keep the United States of america neutral. In the event of this not succeeding, we make Mexico a proposal of alliance on the following basis: make war together, make peace together, generous financial support and an understanding on our part that Mexico is to reconquer the lost territory in Texas, New Mexico, and arizona. The settlement in detail is left to you. You will inform the President of the above most . secretly as soon as the outbreak of war with the United States of America is certain and add the suggestion that he should, on his own initiative, Japan to immediate adherence and at the same time mediate between Japan and ourselves. Please call the President's attention to the fact that the ruthless employment of our submarines now offers the prospect of compelling England in a few months to make peace." Signed, ZDIERTARE.



#### **Decision for War**

The Russian Revolution Russia was not a democracy and when they left the war, it removed a barrier to U.S. entry to the war.


# April 2, 1917 The United States declares war on Germany and enters World War I.
